GOOD FAITH ESTIMATE

Under the law, healthcare providers must provide to patients, who don't have insurance or who are not using insurance, an estimate of the bill for medical items and services upon request.

You have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate for the total expected cost of any non-emergency items or services. This includes related costs like medical tests, equipment and office fees.

You can also ask your healthcare provider, and any other provider you choose, for a Good Faith Estimate before you schedule an item or service.

If you receive a bill that is at least \$400.00 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you can dispute the bill.

Make sure to save a copy or picture of your Good Faith Estimate.

The Good Faith Estimate does not include any unknown or unexpected costs that may arise during treatment. It also does not include services or treatment provided by physicians who are either independent practitioners in private practice and not employed by Seattle Naturopathic and Acupuncture Center or providers we contract with for certain services. This may include pathology, radiology, medicine and herbs, and laboratory services. You could be charged more if complications or special circumstances occur.
